A MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL CITY OF PINEVILLE, LOUISIANA SEPTEMBER 13, 2016 – 6:00 P.M.

MINUTES

Mayor Clarence R. Fields and the Council of the City of Pineville, Louisiana, met in regular session on Tuesday, September 13, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 910 Main Street, Pineville, Louisiana.

- 1. The Mayor called the meeting to order.
- 2. Councilman Martin gave the invocation.
- 3. Councilman Dorn led the Pledge of Allegiance.

- 5. A motion was made by Councilwoman Galloway and seconded by Councilman Dorn to accept the minutes of the August 9, 2016 meeting as published. The floor was opened for public comment. On vote, the motion carried.
- 6. A motion was made by Councilman Dorn and seconded by Councilwoman Galloway to accept the financial report as read by Finance Director, Mark Roberts. The floor was opened for public comment. On vote, the motion carried.
- 7. Mr. Nick Blackstone spoke about what the Louisiana National Guard's Youth Challenge Program (YCP) at Camp Beauregard has to offer adolescents who are seeking an alternative educational program as opposed to the traditional high school classroom.
 - Mr. Mike Francis spoke about the upcoming election for Public Service Commissioner and his candidacy for the District 4 seat which is currently held by Mr. Clyde Holloway.
 - Ms. Mary Werner, also a candidate for Public Service Commissioner, District 4, addressed the Council and audience members about her candidacy in the November 8th primary as well.
 - The Mayor recognized audience member and former President of Louisiana College, Dr. Aguillard.
- 8. Finance Committee Chairperson, Councilwoman Frederic, gave a report of the meeting held on Monday, August 22, 2016. The report and the Committee's recommendations on monthly water and sewer rates are as follows:

Observations by administration, staff, external auditor and city engineer prompt the Finance Committee to recommend adjustment of rate schedules for water and sewer services by the City of Pineville. The last time City rates for water, sewer, sanitation and trash services were adjusted was 12 years ago, in 2004. It is commendable that despite rising costs of manpower and equipment Pineville's sanitation and trash services have been sustained as well as they have. The Committee found this demonstrated serious expense management and "belt-tightening" many constituents and City Council Members look for and expect from City Administration. At this time the Finance Committee does not recommend any change to those rates.

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In the water and sewer realm, however, no amount of "belt-tightening" is sufficient to cover growing regulatory pressures, aging infrastructure failures and expectations by residential and commercial users for RELIABLE and safe water service and sewer function every time they turn on a tap or flush a toilet, whether at home or in their businesses.

Therefore rate adjustments are recommended for revenue requirements to meet:

--costs of ongoing and new regulatory compliance for these systems including growing requirement for operator qualifications, and for required commitments by the City for regulatory compliance expenditures. --aging water and sewer infrastructure and critical failures often requiring immediate repair.

The matter of aging and failing infrastructure is being dealt with across Louisiana and across America. All providers of crucial water and sewer services are addressing costs and expectations from users of these important services.

The Finance Committee considered these matters carefully and at length. We were sensitive to the impact of requirements upon City systems <u>and the expectations</u> of those using City water and sewer services.

The recommended rates by the Finance Committee place the City of Pineville's charges for these services <u>at or below the median</u> of some 50 Louisiana municipalities providing similar services.

The rates per month recommended by the Finance Committee:

After considering the intrinsic value of essential water and sewer services, and compared across the state of similar services, and compared to costs of many consumer goods and services across the market, the Committee respectfully recommends these rates to the City Council as necessary and fair.
