

The children were competing for the chance to represent five geographic divisions at the national finals, which will be held in conjunction with the CITGO Bassmaster Classic, Aug. 1-3. Each of the divisions will send two children (one from each age group) to the finals, where the top-scoring child in each age group will walk away with a \$5,000 scholarship.
