## **Sales Tax Rededication Passes**

The citizens of Pineville have spoken regarding the rededication of the 1 cent sales tax enacted in 1978. In the July 21st vote **512** (**83%**) voted **YES** and **108** (**17%**) voted **NO** to allow 1/2 of the tax to be used to purchase equipment such as trash and garbage trucks, tractors and other heavy equipment. This tax was formerly restricted to only be used for capital improvements, such as roads and buildings. The rededication will allow Pineville to upgrade its aging heavy equipment and thus offer better services to all citizens. 


in honor of our nation's independence. Featured musical groups
