MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCES PLANNED

Pineville, LA – Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities throughout the country will observe Memorial Day on Monday, May 27, with ceremonies recognizing service members who have given their lives for their country.

Flags will be placed on the 7,816 graves at the Alexandria National Cemetery at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 25, in preparation for Memorial Day. The Alexandria National Cemetery is located at 209 East Shamrock Street in Pineville. The public is invited to attend to be a part of this annual tradition.

On Monday, May 27, the Memorial Day Program at the National Cemetery will begin at 9:45 a.m. with a musical prelude. After the flag raising, the program will continue with guest speaker, The Honorable Jeffery Hall, Mayor of the City of Alexandria, placing of wreaths by various Veteran service organizations, a rifle salute and the playing of taps.

Some seating will be available, but you are welcome to bring your lawn chairs. In case of bad weather, the ceremony will be held at the Alexandria VA Medical Center's Auditorium, Building 8, located at 2495 Shreveport Highway, Pineville. In addition to the formal ceremonies planned across the nation, all Americans are asked to participate in a National Moment of Remembrance by pausing wherever they are at 3:00 pm on Monday, May 27, and taking a moment to remember and honor those men and women who died in service to our country.
